



Bar brings New York to Surfers

A GOLD Coast waterfront property that was home to the popular Surfers Rowers dining and entertainment venue is being transformed into a New York City-inspired restaurant with lounge bar and a functions centre.

The Burleigh-based Rayjon Group is undertaking a \$2 million overhaul of the property, at 150 Bundall Rd, to be re-branded One50 Public House.

The venue will have a contemporary city vibe and be an upmarket take on the traditional pub.

The refurbishment follows Rayjon's \$3.84 million acquisition from receivers last May of the 3145sq m Bundall property holding, about half of which is parking space.

Rayjon developments include the Treetops and Christine Corner shopping centres.

Rayjon general manager Jeremy Dunn said One50 Public House would open in March and employ 35 staff.

"Being just 2km from Surfers Paradise and in the heart of the Bundall office precinct, we are poised to tap into the area's growing workforce," he said.

The city council is making its base in Bundall where it has acquired three office buildings, Waterside East, Waterside West and Zurich House.
